	No Total Loss - A Total Loss vehicle is an automobile that has been stolen, dismantled or damaged by impact, collision, fire or floc such that the estimated cost of repairing it exceeds the difference between the fair market value of the vehicle prior to the damages
	Good news! The vehicle has not been reported to have been declared to be a total loss by a jurisdiction or an insurance company that covers the lo or takes possession of the vehicle and/or title. Vehicles that are declared a total loss can have issues that affect the vehicle's safety and/or value.
	No Prior Owner Retained - An Owner Retained Title is issued when an insurance company deems a vehicle to be a total loss and the owner chooses to retain possession of the vehicle.
	Good news! The vehicle has not been reported to be previously branded as owner retained as salvage.
	No Salvage - A vehicle is considered salvaged when it has been damaged in excess of approximately 70% of its pre-accident market value. The exact percentage depends on the insurance provider, as well as any applicable laws and regulations.
	Good news! The vehicle has not been reported to have been wrecked, destroyed or damaged to the extent that the total cost of parts and labor to legally rebuild the vehicle exceeds the jurisdiction's defined percentage of the retail value of the vehicle. Salvage brands can also be the result of abandonment, an insurance total loss, or of an insurance company settlement with the vehicle's owner without regard to the extent of the damage. Salvage vehicles often have issues that affect the vehicle's safety and/or value.
	No Owner Retained Salvage - Owner Retained Salvage is when the vehicle has been declared a total loss and the titled owner retains ownership of the vehicle.
	V The vehicle has not been reported to have been declared a total loss by an insurance company with the owner maintaining ownership. Vehicles that are declared a total loss can have issues that affect the vehicle's safety and/or value.
	No Crushed - A vehicle is "crushed" when a junk automobile is stripped of all useful parts and then is compressed prior to transport for recycling.

	No Vehicle Non-Conformity - Vehicle Non-Conformity refers to non-safety defect that is reported by the vehicle manufacturer.

	No Recovered Theft - A vehicle is considered "recovered theft" when an insurance company acquires the automobile in the settlement of a theft claim.

No Vandalism - A vandalized vehicle is one that has been intentionally defaced or destroyed.

No Bond Posted - A Bond is posted on the vehicle when the owner has no proof of ownership during the titling process. The bor will normally remain in effect for 3 years or until it is no longer registered by the State.
The vehicle has not been reported to have had a bonded title issued by an insurance company because ownership of the vehicle cannot be prove thus allowing the vehicle to be sold and titled.
No Cash for Clunkers - "Cash for Clunkers" is a program that allows car owners to trade in their old, less fuel-efficient vehicles i exchange for more fuel-efficient vehicles. In the US, this program is formally known as the Car Allowance Rebate System (CARS

No Junk - A Junk vehicle is a term used to describe any automobile that is not legal to drive on public roads. This includes any vehicle that is not licensed or insured, or one that is dismantled to the extent to be classified as "junk".

Good news! The vehicle has not been reported to have an odometer reading other than the true mileage for the vehicle. Odometer problems can render the actual mileage to be unknown which affects maintenance scheduling, warranties and vehicle value.
No Odometer Replacement - Replaced odometers can show inaccurate readings.
Good news! The vehicle has not been reported to have a replaced odometer. This is an odometer which is not the odometer put in the vehicle when manufactured. Odometer problems can render the actual mileage to be unknown which affects maintenance scheduling, warranties and vehicle value.
No Other Odometer Problem Exists - Any other odometer problems with the vehicle.
Good news! The titling authority does not know of other problem with the odometer reading that it cannot print on a title.
No Prior Non-Repairable/Repaired - The vehicle is considered to have non-repairable damage when it has sustained irreversible damage to any exterior, interior or structural aspects of the vehicle.
The vehicle has not been reported to have been constructed by repairing a vehicle that has been destroyed or declared to be non-repairable or otherwise declared to not be eligible for titling because of the extent of damage to the vehicle but has been issued a title pursuant to state law after falling within this criterion with this brand on the face of the certificate of title.

No Rebuilt - A Reconstructed or Rebuilt Vehicle is a salvage automobile that has been repaired and restored back to operation typically using refurbished parts.



No Logging Vehicle - A Logging Vehicle is defined as an automobile that is operated on private roads primarily for logging purposes.

The vehicle has not been reported to be used primarily for logging purposes.

The National Motor Vehicle Title Information System (NMVTIS) is an electronic system that contains information on certain automobiles titled in the United States. NMVTIS is intended to serve as a reliable source of title and <u>brand</u> history for automobiles, but it does not contain detailed information regarding a vehicle's repair history.

All states, insurance companies, and junk and salvage yards are required by federal law to regularly report information to NMVTIS. However, NMVTIS does not contain information on all motor vehicles in the United States because <u>some states</u> are not yet providing their vehicle data to the system. Currently, the data provided to NMVTIS by states is provided in a variety of time frames; while some states report and update NMVTIS data in "real-time" (as title transactions occur), other states send updates less frequently, such as once every 24 hours or within a period of days.

Information on previous, significant vehicle damage may not be included in the system if the vehicle was never determined by an insurance company (or other appropriate entity) to be a "total loss" or branded by a state titling agency. Conversely, an insurance carrier may be required to report a "total loss" even if the vehicle's titling-state has not determined the vehicle to be "salvage" or "junk."

A vehicle history report is NOT a substitute for an independent vehicle inspection. Before making a decision to purchase a vehicle, consumers are strongly encouraged to also obtain an independent vehicle inspection to ensure the vehicle does not have hidden damage. The <u>Approved NMVTIS Data Providers</u> (look for the NMVTIS logo) can include vehicle condition data from sources other than NMVTIS.

NMVTIS data INCLUDES (as available by those entities required to report to the System):

Information from participating state motor vehicle titling agencies.

Information on automobiles, buses, trucks, motorcycles, recreational vehicles, motor homes, and tractors. NMVTIS may not currently include commercial vehicles if those vehicles are not included in a state's primary database for title

records (in some states, those vehicles are managed by a separate state agency), although these records may be added at a later time. Information on "brands" applied to vehicles provided by participating state motor vehicle titling agencies. Brand types and definitions vary by state, but may provide useful information about the condition or prior use of the vehicle. Most recent odometer reading in the state's title record. Information from insurance companies, and auto recyclers, including junk and salvage yards, that is required by law to be reported to the system, beginning March 31, 2009. This information will include if the vehicle was determined to be a "total loss" by an insurance carrier. Information from junk and salvage yards receiving a "cash for clunker" vehicle traded-in under the Consumer Assistance to Recycle and Save Act of 2009 (CARS) Program. Consumers are advised to visit www.vehiclehistory.gov for details on how to interpret the information in the system and understand the meaning of various labels applied to vehicles by the participating state motor vehicle titling agencies.
